



1.1 Bringing Pets to China

If you want to bring your furry family members to China, this guide may help you.



Things you need to know before bringing pets to China



Only dogs and cats are allowed into China.



One pet is allowed per carrier per entry.



Pets should be implanted with electronic chips.

Note: Pets must undergo an animal health clinical inspection conducted by the official agencies of the departing country or region within 14 days prior to their arrival in China. This inspection is crucial to ensure that the pets are free from rabies or any other infectious or parasitic animal diseases.

When your pets need quarantine





Pets without chips.



Pets without rabies antibody test reports issued by a laboratory trusted by China Customs from non-designated countries or regions.



Pets found with symptoms of zoonotic diseases and parasitic diseases during on-site clinical examinations.

If your pets need to be isolated for quarantine, they should enter China at the ports where quarantine facilities are built, and they need to be quarantined for 30 days at the quarantine site designated by Customs.

1.2 Dog Breeds Prohibited in Shanghai



The following dog breeds are not allowed to be kept in Shanghai.

2. Pet Licensing

2.1 Dog Licensing

In Shanghai, dog owners are obligated to obtain a license for their pets. Due to the city's one-dog-per-home policy, tenants must seek approval from their landlord before owning a dog and registering it at their residential address. Here are some guidelines to help you with the application process.



Materials required



I. Personal identification certificate (Chinese ID card or other accepted ID including passport).

> Note: Owner who raises the dog must be an adult (over 18 years old) and have a fixed place of residence in Shanghai.



Property ownership certificate or proof of a property lease agreement.



3. Dog's immunization certificate.



4. Certificate of Shanghai Dog Neutering Operation if your dog has been neutered.

Offline registration



1. The dog owner goes to local police station and submits the application materials.



2. The handling police officer will review the application materials on the spot. If there are any errors in the application materials, they can be corrected on the spot. If the application materials are incomplete or do not comply with requirements, the applicant will receive a notice of correction within five working days.



3. If the application materials are complete and correct, the dog owner needs to pay the annual dog management fee. The police station should issue a receipt and provide a certificate of registration for the dog owner.

> Note: In Shanghai, the annual registration fee for each dog is 500 yuan (US\$68.45) in core areas within the Inner Ring Road, and 300 yuan in other areas, with no charges required in rural areas.



4. The police station will complete the review of dog registration materials within 10 working days. For those that meet the conditions, a dog registration certificate and a license tag will be issued.

Online registration

All application procedures can now be completed on WeChat mini-program Suishenban, and physical licenses will be issued to owners later. (Note: all the services provided online are in Chinese.)



Step 1

Search and open the Wechat mini-program Suishenban, tap "か 事" (Services) at the bottom of the page.



Step 2

Find and open
the tag "立明养犬一件事"
(One-stop services for dog owners).



The platform will remind dog owners to renew their licenses one month before they expire.

When submitting documents online, owners should upload household and personal documentation, including the owner's passport, a valid visa, a household lease contract, and a commitment letter, in addition to immunization records.

Owners shall have the annual review for the dog license within 30 days before the validity period. The dog's valid immunization certificate must be provided, and the annual dog management fee should be paid.

3.1 Purchasing Pet Insurance

A visit to the veterinarian can become quite expensive and buying pet insurance has become a popular way to reduce costs. China's multifunctional app AliPay offers pet insurance to protect your furry friend's health. Here is a guide to how to buy a pet insurance policy.



Search "pet insurance" (宠物保险)on the Alipay app.





There are two types of insurance: medical insurance and liability insurance.

Medical insurance is for veterinary services, while liability insurance covers the damage caused by your dog or cat if it injures someone.

This works like your health insurance — the lower the deductible, the higher your premium. For instance, the pet medical insurance has three plans: the basic version covers up to 5,000 yuan (\$695) in medical fees per year; the upgraded version has a limit of 15,000 yuan per year; and the luxury plan covers up to 30,000 yuan per year. Usually, a higher proportion of medical fees can be disbursed for treatment at designated pet clinics.

Note: You can turn on the Alipay app's translation service in "Settings" – "General" – "Translation Tool".

After selecting an insurance package, complete your pet's profile, including species, name, birth date and gender.

Then upload profile photos of your pet and choose its breed. Confirm the information and proceed.

Now you can check the details of your policy or file a claim in "My Policy" (我的保单).

Insurance packages usually require a waiting period before benefits kick in to prevent pet owners from purchasing policies after their pets get sick. The waiting periods vary, from 10 days for accident coverage, to 3 days for common diseases, and 90 days for more serious problems like cancer and oral

disorders.

4.2 DIDI Rolls Out Pet-friendly Ride Service





Many pet owners may have experienced the annoyance of being rejected by taxis when taking their furry friends along with them. Fortunately, this may now become a thing of the past.

DIDI Chuxing, a leading car-hailing service provider in China, has launched pet-friendly rides which allow passengers to travel with their furry companions.

The service was first unveiled across 49 major cities in August, and more recently has been promoted across the entire country.



To use the service, pet owners need only to open the DIDI Chuxing app, and find "宠物出行(Travel with a pet)".

If you don't find the pet icon on the homepage, click "更多服务 (More services)".

You also need to choose the basic information about your pet, including its type and size.

Then enter the destination and select the type of vehicle you want to take before halling a ride.



There are two types of vehicles available—DIDI Express, which offers more affordable services, and DIDI Premier, which is operated by high-end vehicles.

To attract passengers, DIDI has introduced discounts of up to 30 percent for riders of Express cars during the promotion period.

5. Pet Care Essentials

5.1 Code of Conduct for Pet Owners



As a pet owner, you are liable for any harm caused by your pet. If your pet injures someone, you are responsible for compensating the injured party for medical expenses and other losses. However, if it can be proven that the injury resulted from the intentional teasing of your pet by the injured party, your liability may be mitigated or eliminated.

In the case of injuries caused by a prohibited dangerous pet, such as a Tibetan Mastiff, your liability will not be mitigated or eliminated.

Anyone who allows their animal to harm others will be subject to detention and fines. It is mandatory to provide identification tags for your pets, and large dogs must be muzzled. When walking your dog, it should be on a leash less than 2 meters long, and the leash should be kept tight in crowded areas.

Additionally, it is crucial to promptly remove any feces left by your pet.





Furthermore, bringing dogs into office buildings, schools, and other public spaces is prohibited. Pet owners are strongly encouraged to purchase dog liability insurance to ensure coverage for any potential incidents.

→ 6. Pet Export

6.1 Pet Export

When taking pets out of China, it's important to comply with the entry regulations of your intended destination. To ensure a smoothly process, follow these steps:





Familiarize yourself with the pet health requirements of the destination country or region and obtain the necessary documents issued by a pet hospital approved by the Shanghai Municipal Commission of Agriculture and Rural Affairs.

About a week to 10 days before your departure, submit all required documents, including the pet's health and vaccination records, your identity information, and flight details, to Huangpu Customs online through the international trade single window to acquire an Animal Health Certificate. If needed, you can authorize a qualified pet hospital or a customs clearance agency to handle the process on your behalf.
